




















## Trixies Transformation

When we saw her at Corpus Christi Animal Care Services, we knew we couldn't leave her behind—we tagged her for rescue and brought her into our care. Despite her pain, there was a light in her—a quiet resilience that told us she wasn't ready to give up. Thanks to your generosity, we were able to provide the treatment, comfort, and love she so desperately needed, giving her a second chance at life.

With each passing day, Trixie's transformation became more remarkable. Her skin began to heal, the painful redness and irritation started to fade, and soft new fur started growing in. Even more incredible was the change in her spirit—Trixie was learning to trust again. No longer fearful and withdrawn, she began to embrace the love and care surrounding her. ## Camp Happy Tails







The Humane Education Program at Gulf Coast Humane Society experienced an incredible year in 2024, achieving milestones that reflect how much the program has grown in just two years.

What started as just an idea has now evolved into a cornerstone of our outreach efforts, engaging over 127 groups and over 6,000 students this year alone. This rapid growth highlights the importance of humane education in shaping a more compassionate community and shows how deeply the program resonates with young learners and their families.

A major highlight of the year was Camp Happy Tails, which welcomed more than 450 campers. This dynamic program provides children with hands-on opportunities to learn about empathy, animal welfare, and the responsibilities of pet ownership in a fun, interactive setting.

In addition to the success of Camp Happy Tails, we expanded our programming into new coastal communities, broadening our reach and bringing humane education to areas previously underserved.

This expansion reflects both the increasing demand for our services and our team's dedication to creating a more compassionate future.

As we plan for 2025, we're focused on continuing this upward trajectory—reaching more students, building new partnerships, and making an even greater impact. ### **Food Pantry**

In 2024, Gulf Coast Humane Society made significant strides in supporting pet owners throughout the Coastal Bend with the expansion of our Pet Food Pantry, a success made possible through our strategic partnership with Greater Goods Charities and the Coastal Bend Food Bank. This collaboration has enabled us to extend our reach and provide essential resources to a greater number of families, ensuring that pets remain in their homes even in times of financial hardship.

In the past, our efforts were limited to smaller-scale pet food drives held at Gulf Coast Humane Society, which restricted the number of families we could assist. However, with the invaluable support of Greater Goods Charities and the Coastal Bend Food Bank, we were able to distribute over 140,000 pounds of pet food in 2024, significantly increasing our impact across the region.

This expanded partnership has allowed us to address a critical need, providing families with the resources they require to care for their pets and preventing the unfortunate surrender of animals due to financial constraints. By alleviating this burden, we have not only helped preserve the bond between pets and their owners but have also contributed to reducing the number of animals entering shelters.

Thanks to the collective efforts of our partners, volunteers, and donors, we have been able to broaden our scope and serve a larger geographical area. We are deeply grateful for the continued support that has made this expansion possible and look forward to further advancing our mission in the years to come. Together, we are ensuring that no pet goes hungry and that all families have the resources they need to care for their beloved companions.

## Hardaway's Home

Hardaway's journey is nothing short of extraordinary. He was found alone on the streets, scared, suffering, and completely blind, with no one to care for him. Despite his pain, he had the will to keep going, and when he arrived at our shelter, we knew we had to do everything we could to help him.

After undergoing a double eye enucleation to relieve his pain, Hardaway faced another challenge—being diagnosed with both Feline Leukemia and Feline Immunodeficiency Virus. These diagnoses can make it harder for cats to find homes, but through it all, Hardaway never stopped purring, never stopped hoping, and never gave up on the possibility of a family who would love him just as he was.

For over two months, Hardaway healed in our care, winning over the hearts of everyone he met with his affectionate nature and unshakable trust. He didn't need to see to know when someone was near—he would greet every visitor with the sweetest head boops, curling up into their laps, eager for love. His spirit shined so brightly that it was impossible not to fall in love with him.

Then, everything changed. Hardaway's story was shared in the Fort Worth Star-Telegram, reaching far beyond the walls of our shelter. A family in Dallas read about his journey and knew, without a doubt, that he was meant to be theirs. They made the long drive, eager to meet the cat who had already captured their hearts from miles away. The moment they met him in person, it was clear—Hardaway had found his home.

Now, Hardaway will never have to wonder what it feels like to be safe, warm, and truly loved. He has a family who adores him, a place where he belongs, and a future filled with gentle hands, cozy naps, and endless affection. His world may be dark, but his life is now brighter than ever.





